Term 1 reports will be issued this coming Monday at 3 pm. These reports provide a comprehensive picture of your child's progress at this stage of the year. They contain an overall numerical grade based on IB criteria in order to give you an accurate picture of how your child achieved and performed this term. The narrative part of the report is equally important as it provides specific information regarding performance, attitude and goal setting. A grade of '2' or less is considered a failing mark.

Following on from the reports the Parent-Student-Teacher Conference will be held from Thursday 23rd from 8.00 am-4.00 pm. The electronic sign-up form will be available shortly. The conferences provide time for you to discuss further with subject teachers the progress of your child based on the report comments and grades awarded. Although I hope that you can all attend the conference, I highly recommend that you make appointments with teachers if your child is struggling in a particular area to clarify the support required in the school-home partnership.

This is a reminder that the CIS/NEASC Visit is now drawing very near. Our visitors will be meeting with BMIS faculty, students, and members of the community, including observing classes during the week of the 13th of February.



Together you will identify a product suitable for learning in a subject such as maths or science (to name a few) – you need to consider Criterion C skills assessment before deciding on your product, so don't take the easy way out.

Year 12 Extended Essay Cafe


