
Until then, grab a "cuppa" as you read and stay "In the Loop!"

"On the 25th of July, I participated in a ladies online chess tournament which consisted of 11 rounds; this tournament determined the players participating in the Fide Online Olympiad. In this chess tournament, I managed to come first and I won all my games, therefore I qualified to participate in the ladies' section during the Olympiad. "

During the 20th to the 25th August, the Malawi team competed in division 4 of the Olympiad. Throughout the tournament, team Malawi won against 9 of the 11 countries that they were paired against, and ranked fourth in division four. Priyasha and the Malawi team have now qualified for the next round to compete in division three.

The Division 3 tournament will be held from the 27th to the 29th of August, where team Malawi will have an opportunity to play against stronger teams. This tournament will consist of 11 rounds, with a total of 16 countries participating.
