I am excited to share this week's updates, so please settle down and grab a "cuppa" as you stay "In the Loop!"

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

Year 6 Transition



Service: Breast and Cervical Cancer Project

Over the past 6 weeks our Year 12 students Langelihle, Mercy, Xiaofan, Atiyyah, and Mauro have taken part in a Breast and Cervical Cancer Pathway Project led by Dr. Addai a Ghanian doctor who has implemented this project in different African countries. They spent the first few weeks learning the science behind cancer, and the treatments one can get. As of now, they've been taking a closer look into cancer in Malawi. For example, Langelihle states "we found out that the 5-year survival rate for breast cancer in Malawi is 0%". By the end of the project, the students will write a foreword mapping out the life of a person with Breast or Cervical cancer in Malawi noting the distance between a chosen person in a chosen location and their nearest hospital.
