Auditions for 'THE GREATEST SHOWMAN'



#### **SATs**

I am the college counselor at BMIS and I'd like to introduce myself to you briefly, before getting to the SATs. I am beginning my fourth year at BMIS, and my second consecutive year as the College Counselor. Prior to coming to Malawi with my family, I had worked at international schools in Zimbabwe, Zambia and Oman as a Language & Literature and an Individuals and Societies teacher. I continue to teach MYP and DP Language & Literature at BMIS. Before becoming a teacher, I had an eleven-year career in university admissions at a variety of schools (both graduate and undergraduate) in the United States. Now, onto the SATs...

The SAT is an entrance exam used by most colleges and universities to make admissions decisions. The SAT is a multiple-choice, pencil-and-paper test created and administered by the College Board.

The purpose of the SAT is to measure a high school student's readiness for college, and provide colleges with one common data point that can be used to compare all applicants.

We are very pleased to announce that BMIS has become an SAT testing center and will be administering the SAT on three occasions this academic year:

Test Dates October 1 December 3 May 6
Registration Deadlines September 2 November 3 April 24

During an upcoming College Counseling class before the September registration deadline, I will speak with Y12 and Y13 students about whether they should consider sitting for the exam. The SAT is accepted at schools in 85 countries outside of the U.S. (and it is required by many of these institutions or is used for scholarship consideration), so it is worth checking into. Here is a <u>list of schools outside the U.S. that accept the SAT</u>. Your child can register for the SAT <u>here</u>.

The school has new SAT test prep materials coming in the shipment that is expected to arrive soon. In the meantime, students can go to Khan Academy to begin preparation.
