YEAR 10 MUSIC CONCERT


Dave Montreuil, our Music teacher, shares:

From keyboards to drums, acoustic guitars to electric, vocals and bass, there's a role for everyone to make it a special performance! We can't wait to share it with you!






Talent Show! Talent Show!

A message from our school nurse, Prisca Palasa

Dear BMIS Community,

There is an outbreak of chickenpox within the City. There is one case reported so far from our school in Year 2, and the student is getting treatment at home. Chickenpox is a viral disease caused by Varicella zoster virus. It is contagious.

Anyone can get this infection, even those that had a vaccine against it earlier, although their symptoms are usually milder. The chickenpox symptoms are an itchy rash, small fluid filled blisters that usually appear in waves for two to four days, then more rash appear all over the body including the mouth, eyelids and even genital areas. The rash turns into scabs. It usually takes a week for all blisters to become scabs.

Two days before the eruption of the rash, one may present with fevers, tiredness, loss of appetite and headache. This is the tricky and most contagious period. Students with the suspected signs should stay home until after 3 days, to rule it out. Those with chicken pox should remain isolated until hey have scabs, which is usually after 1 week. During this time, they can be taking their treatment at home accordingly.

Let's all be alert and keep updating each other for the safety of our community. Prisca Palasa - School Nurse
