"The Secondary PHE department is so excited to announce that next year we will be offering Sport and Exercise, Health Science (SEHS) in the Diploma Programme. SEHS combines all three Sciences (Physics, Chemistry and Biology) and relates them to a sporting context.

Topics range from Sport Psychology, Nutrition and Anatomy to Biomechanics, Genetics and Exercise Physiology. We are working hard to create an extensive and engaging curriculum alongside the Science department so that students can learn new concepts in a fun and stimulating environment. "


